Twenty members of the Baltimore City Department of General Services (DGS) participated in the National Day of Service and Remembrance on September 11, 2015 by volunteering with Business Volunteers Maryland at the Baltimore Community ToolBank in honor of those lost on September 11, 2001.

"Beyond maintaining the City's properties, or managing the fleet, many DGS employees give back to our community," said DGS Director Steve Sharkey. It is a pleasure to serve in an organization that can give back to the community in so many ways."
