Remember, the city is completely online for the application process; no paper applications or interest cards will be accepted for Civil Services positions! To apply for a position you must create an account, which is done by going to www.governmentjobs.com, this will be the application that is reviewed by the Human Resources Office so make sure you keep it updated. The more information you have, the better your chances are to obtain your dream job or a promotion.

With this process you can scan and add information to your account. Things you may want to scan include but not limited to: resume, cover letter, certifications, and any licenses you may hold.

The website also has a Job Notification section that will send reminders when positions are posted that you and/or a friend are interested.
