#### PEALE ROOF WINS AWARD

MAJOR PROJECTS AND HISTORIC PROPERTIES COORDINATE ROOF REPLACEMENT

Earlier this month DGS contractor, Ruff Roofers, received an award from the Building Congress & Exchange for the design and execution of roof repairs on the Peale Museum. The project was judged based on craftsmanship overall including the quality of work, complexity of both



technical and design challenges and the level of difficulty with site conditions, constraints and time frame.

Shaquita Gause from the Major Projects Division managed the exterior restoration of the building which brought the building's facade back to life. However, the roof of the building was still in need of attention. The roof was originally a copper standing seam roof that had rusted over the years, but it has been transformed from rust to a new color, "freedom grey." Jackson Gilman-Forlini from the Historic Properties office worked with the tenant to secure public and private funds to complete the work and helped to develop a design consistent with historic preservation standards.

DGS is proud to have orchestrated the restoration of the Peale, so it can continue to be a public space that brings important cultural currency to downtown Baltimore.

DGS' own, Bob Gibson, has been recognized by American City & County as a 2018 Exemplary Public Servant. American City & County selected year's this winners based exclusively on their accomplishments in 2018 and the impact those actions had on the communities they serve.

Bob's recognition was due in part to his involvement on the creation of the gainsharing program, where Fleet employees are encouraged and empowered to identify and implement operational changes that improve service and reduce costs. The program incentivizes higher performance through structured involvement and employee participation. Over a six-month pilot, the program resulted in nearly \$350,000 in cost avoidance without impacting the quality of the services our mechanics provided. The Western District Police Station 2nd floor demolition and renovation concluded in November 2018. The project was designed by Carole Young and involved the complete renovation and substantial redesign of the entire 2nd floor. The project included the creation of a new open office area with space for 22 workstations, four new offices, a new locker room and shower for female officers, and the renovation of the male officers' restroom.

The Facilities team and Baltimore Police Department hoped to make the building more inviting to the public and more accommodating to the officers, while maximizing the use of space. This project completes the comprehensive renovation of the Western Police District, complimenting the previous renovation of the first floor by DGS and a donor group.
